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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The extremist forces behind Project 2025 want to impose a dark and radical agenda on our country – one that would strip us of our freedom to make decisions about our own bodies and our freedom to provide a good life for our families, leave us at the mercy of greedy corporations and controlling billionaires, undermine education, dismantle environmental protections, and rob us of democracy itself.

These very same forces have been quietly preparing for their national takeover right here in Florida – **using our state like their swamp creature laboratory to test some of their most dangerous ideas.**

In fact, a new investigation finds that the masterminds behind Project 2025 have worked on more than 100-state level bills in Florida over the past four years. More than three-quarters of those bills have been passed by our state's Republican-controlled Legislature and signed into law by Republican Gov. Ron DeSantis.

These Project 2025 policies in Florida have eliminated access to abortion for most women and pregnant people. They have enabled book-banning and censorship in public

schools and universities. They have put immigrants and queer communities in physical danger, and imposed systematic voter suppression on young people and people of color.

That's not nearly all of it. Project 2025 policies in Florida have also driven up costs for renters and homeowners by allowing insurance companies to charge exorbitant rates. They have forced farmworkers and construction workers to toil in 100-degree heat without water or rest. They have made it harder for small businesses to compete with corporate giants, rolled back gun-safety laws, and undermined efforts to combat the climate crisis.

The corporations and billionaires behind Project 2025 want to control us, decide our futures for us, and attack the freedoms of all working families.

Let the experience of Florida over the past four years serve as a warning to the rest of the country: **No one is safe from Project 2025.**

METHODOLOGY

An investigation by Florida For All identified nearly 120 pieces of legislation filed in Florida since 2021 that are linked to Project 2025. These are bills that were lobbied for, promoted, or otherwise supported by the organizations that serve on the Project 2025 advisory board and helped to write its “Mandate for Leadership” blueprint. Their support can be documented through lobbying appearances, press releases, white papers, legal filings, and other public sources of information.

It is important to note that the Project 2025 influence on Florida extends far beyond legislation. Project 2025 organizations have also worked directly with the DeSantis administration on executive orders, litigation, and personnel decisions. Their employees are embedded throughout state government from the Department of Education and precedent-setting appellate courts to the state historical commission and a public venture-capital fund. Project 2025 members have hosted Florida policymakers at events and supplied research to legislative staffers. They have even supported state election-crimes investigations.

THE EXPERIMENTS

Of the nearly 120 Project 2025 bills filed in Florida over the last few years, the following 12 dubbed the “Dirty Dozen” have been selected to showcase the impact this ultra-conservative plan has already had on working people in Florida and the issues we care about most.

SMALL BUSINESSES SB 170 - LOCAL ORDINANCES (2023)

This Florida law severely diminishes the power of local communities to make decisions that are in the best interests of everyone by enabling big businesses to block any new rules they don't like. It could be leveraged by companies to sue over labor rights, small business support, and environmental protections – to name a few.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

SB 170 will have far-reaching impacts that will ultimately hurt everyday people and small businesses. It could be leveraged by developers, power companies, and retailers to defeat local attempts to lower real estate, utility, and food costs. It will also

further advantage big businesses over small ones, as only large corporations will have the resources to litigate – and they now have a mechanism to derail any efforts to specifically assist locally owned companies.

EXTRA CREDIT

SB 346 (2023) restricted local governments' ability to implement local hire programs and also enabled larger corporate groups to win more contracts from local governments.

LABOR

HB 433 - EMPLOYMENT REGULATIONS (2024)

This Florida law severely limits local governments' ability to help workers win higher pay, better benefits and safer workplaces. It will invalidate local "Living Wage" laws, which will allow companies contracting with governments to cut pay for tens of thousands of workers around the state.

The law has also prohibited "Fair Work Week" laws, which are meant to ensure hourly workers have predictable schedules that they can plan their lives around. And it has blocked local rules that would require employers with outdoor workers –like farming companies, homebuilders and construction firms– to provide their workers with safety measures such as access to drinking water and periodic rest breaks, in order to prevent illness and injuries stemming from exposure to extreme heat.

Why it's important

HB 433 poses a significant threat to all working Floridians. It jeopardizes the livelihoods of thousands, including TSA workers, construction workers, janitors, and engineers, among others. This bill is part of a broader trend of undermining worker rights in Florida, favoring corporate interests over working families.

HOUSING AND AFFORDABILITY

SB 2A - PROPERTY INSURANCE (2022)

This Florida law is forcing thousands of homeowners and business owners to pay higher prices for their property insurance – driving up expenses for both Floridians who own their homes and those who rent their homes, as landlords pass on higher insurance costs. At the same time as it helps insurance companies raise rates, the law also allows insurance companies to sell lower-quality insurance and protects companies that unfairly delay or deny legitimate claims. And it has provided enormous taxpayer subsidies to the insurance industry – without any corresponding rate relief for Floridians.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

SB 2A has directly contributed to Florida's affordability crisis. Florida's already-skyrocketing insurance rates have continued to climb since Ron DeSantis signed this industry giveaway into law. And it does nothing to address any of the root causes of Florida's property

insurance problems – which sits at the intersection of both the housing and the climate emergencies. With little to no regulation of the real estate industry nor corporate landlords, and annual disasters (including but not limited to hurricanes) that are made worse by hotter temperatures and higher sea levels, Florida was ranked the least affordable state in the US in 2023.

EXTRA CREDIT

Corporate elites have also passed several other bills that worsen the housing/affordability crisis in our state. HB 1365 (2024) implicitly criminalizes homelessness, by outlawing public sleeping except within state-sanctioned camps. And the state's so-called affordable housing "solution" – SB 102 (2023) – benefits developers rather than directly addressing housing affordability. It even bans all forms of rent control in Florida. Both bills, driven by corporate interests, worsen the housing crisis and disproportionately impact vulnerable communities in Florida.

VOTING RIGHTS

SB 7050 - ELECTIONS (2023)

This Florida law marked the culmination of a years-long campaign to roll back voting rights in Florida. It limits who can help people register to vote, felonizes people who deliver ballots for non-family members, and imposes exorbitant fees for third-party voter registration organizations. It also makes the voter responsible for determining their own voting eligibility, rather than placing that duty on the state

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

With so many new restrictions, bureaucratic hoops, and the threat of large fines, many nonprofits that assist people in registering to vote or accessing their ballot were intimidated to continue their voter registration and get-out-the-vote efforts. Many returning citizens, unable to verify their eligibility to vote, decided not to vote for fear of arrest by the Office of Elections Crimes. This intimidation was intentional- and racially motivated- since 1 out of every 10 Black voters and 1 out of every 10 Latino voters are registered by third-party voter

registration organizations. Only 2% of white voters are registered this way.

EXTRA CREDIT

SB 7050 wasn't the beginning of attacks on our democracy from the backers of Project 2025. They have been eroding voting access with anti-democratic bills for years. SB 524 (2022) created the Office of Election Crimes and significantly increased fines for third-party voter registration organizations, further restricting voter access. It also banned ranked-choice voting and criminalized non-family ballot collection, laying the groundwork for SB 7050's more aggressive restrictions. SB 90 (2021) reduced vote-by-mail accessibility and imposed new restrictions on ballot collection, disproportionately affecting minority communities. SB 2C (2022) redrew congressional districts to dilute Black voting power, further marginalizing voters of color, and completely eliminating an entire majority Black congressional district in North Florida.

EDUCATION

HB 1467— K-12 EDUCATION (2022)

This Florida law enabled rampant book-banning across Florida by providing a mechanism to have books removed from school libraries on the objection of a single person who found any isolated section of a book to be offensive.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

HB 1467 is directly responsible for the plague of book banning that has taken place across Florida public schools. It has censored educators and limited their power to provide materials that students would find relevant and reflective of their lived experience. The majority of books that were banned based on this legislation were written by LGBTQ+ authors and authors of color. This was a clear attempt to whitewash literature that students have access to, and remove diverse representation from libraries. Queer students and Black students will struggle to find themselves

represented in the majority of books that are now available through their school.

EXTRA CREDIT

One of the biggest dangers to our public education system is something that the members of Project 2025 have been pushing for a long time: school vouchers. In 2023, Florida passed a major school vouchers bill, HB 1, that expands Florida's school voucher program and diverts billions in public funds to private and religious schools. The program will cost the state an estimated \$4 billion in its first year, stripping resources from public schools. It also weakens protections for students with disabilities and lowers certification standards for teachers, undermining the quality of education across the state.

REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM

SB 300 - PREGNANCY AND PARENTING SUPPORT (2023)

This Florida law banned abortion at six weeks after last menstruation, which is long before most women know they are pregnant, with no real exceptions for rape, incest, or their health.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

SB 300 had to wait to go into effect while a 15-week abortion ban was litigated in the Florida Supreme Court. Once Florida's right-wing, DeSantis-appointed court denied that Florida's state constitution protected abortion based on the right to privacy, the six-week ban was triggered, and shortly thereafter went into effect. Since May of 2024, approximately 40,000 women have lost the life-saving healthcare that is abortion access. In an effort to stave off the health crisis, voters will have the opportunity to protect legal

abortion by voting on Amendment 4 on the November 2024 ballot.

EXTRA CREDIT

SB 476, also known as the "Abuser Empowerment Bill," was an extreme piece of legislation that, if passed, would have allowed individuals to sue anyone involved in an abortion. This included the friend who drove a woman to a clinic or the doctor who performed the procedure. The bill's potential recognition of fetal personhood could have also led to a ban on IVF treatment, causing widespread fear and public outcry, which ultimately led to its failure.

LGBTQ+ RIGHTS

HB 1557 - PARENTAL RIGHTS IN EDUCATION (2022)

This infamous “Don’t Say Gay or Trans” Florida law significantly limited educator speech and expression, and prohibited talking about LGBTQ+ identity in elementary schools lesson plans.

Why it's important

While sponsors of HB 1557 claimed this was narrow and limited in scope, opponents knew that the outcome would be far-reaching. The bill has not only limited topics of lesson plans, but has resulted in policies that prohibit teachers talking about their spouses and families or displaying pictures of them. Pride flags have been removed. Students are discouraged from expressing themselves. Plus, a subsequent bill expanded this to not only elementary schools, but up through high school, and other bills have attacked sexual identity and gender expression even at universities. Due to this clear attempt at erasure of LGBTQ+ identity, Williams Institute of Law found in a study that 16% of LGBTQ+ parents had left the state of Florida out of fear for themselves and their children’s safety.

Extra Credit

Unfortunately, in recent years Florida has become notorious for passing some of the most extreme anti-LGBTQ+ legislation in the country. SB 254 (2023) represents one of the most severe attacks on transgender rights in Florida’s history. This legislation not only bans gender-affirming care for minors but also severely restricts access to such care for adults, undermining both parental rights and the autonomy of transgender individuals. The bill criminalizes healthcare providers who follow widely accepted medical guidelines and further isolates transgender people by banning insurance coverage for gender-affirming care and restricting TeleHealth access. SB 1438 (2023), which bans drag performances where children might be present, further criminalizes LGBTQ+ expression, aiming to erase queer culture from public life. At the urging of Christian nationalist groups like Moms for Liberty, Florida even passed HB 1521 (2023), a bill to effectively criminalize transgender Floridians using public restrooms.

DO SOMETHING

GUN CONTROL

HB 543 - PUBLIC SAFETY (2022)

This Florida law weakened concealed carry laws to allow purchase of firearms without a license, without training, and without a background check.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

Rather than passing widely popular common-sense gun-safety reforms, the state of Florida caved to NRA and special interests and opened up firearm possession to almost anyone. The exception is anyone convicted of a felony, since they are prohibited from possessing firearms by Federal law. Due to racial bias and assumptions about criminal record, Black men are more frequently targeted by law enforcement if they are suspected of conceal carry. This legislation came after gun deaths were already extremely high in Florida, having risen 20% under Governor DeSantis' leadership. According to Giffords Law Center, states that pass a permitless carry law such as Florida's will see an

increase in gun violence of 13-15%, and a CDC study concluded that "states that passed a permitless carry law suffered from a 22% increase in gun homicide for the three years after the law's passage."

EXTRA CREDIT

HB 543 wasn't the first attack on Floridians' freedom to live without gun violence. SB 1884 (2021) stripped local governments of their power to pass gun-safety reforms, consolidating control of gun laws at the state level. This law stops local communities from taking action to reduce gun violence and from adopting even common-sense safety measures that are widely supported by local residents.

CRIMINAL SYSTEMS

SB 7066 - ELECTION ADMINISTRATION

After Floridians voted to restore the voting rights to most people convicted of felonies by a ballot initiative in 2018, over one million people saw their voting rights restored. However, the following Legislative Session, state lawmakers passed this Florida law to curtail the impact of the constitutional amendment. This law requires those who were enfranchised by the passage of Amendment 4 to pay all fines and legal fees before they can legally register to vote. Importantly and intentionally, it provided no mechanism for people with a conviction record to confirm the amount of those fees, or to verify their eligibility.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

Although Amendment 4 in 2018 passed with over 65% of the vote, showing that Floridians broadly favored voting rights restoration for people released from prison, state legislators immediately sought to

undermine the impact of this with SB 7066. By providing people with prior convictions no way to verify what fines and fees they may still owe and in what counties, by providing no mechanism for any Floridian to verify their voting eligibility, and by later arresting 20 people who voted in good faith (thinking their right to vote was restored because they received a voter ID card), state lawmakers effectively took away a right that had been democratically restored. Afraid of re-arrest and re-criminalization, many returning citizens have opted not to vote. This has undermined not just the rights of people who have a conviction record, but of the majority of Floridian voters who passed a ballot initiative to ensure those rights were restored.

EXTRA CREDIT

SB 524 (2022), signed into law by Governor DeSantis, created the Office of Election Crimes and Security, which was tasked with investigating alleged voter fraud. The establishment of a specialized election police force has since been weaponized against voters who make innocent mistakes

IMMIGRATION

SB 1718 - IMMIGRATION (2023)

This Florida law criminalizes people who cross the state line into Florida with people they know, or “reasonably should know,” are undocumented. It invalidates other states’ driver’s licenses issued to people navigating our complex immigration system, requires hospitals to ask about immigration status, and forces companies with more than 25 employees to use E-Verify. This law also bars DACA recipients from practicing law and requires collecting DNA samples from detained immigrants.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

In its most egregious attack on Floridians who are immigrants, the Florida Legislature sought to criminalize all Floridians born in different countries. The result is wide-reaching legislation that affects all Floridians, not just immigrants, and not just those without a regulated immigration status. SB 1718 has already separated families, driven hard-working, honest people away from our state causing labor shortages

and lost revenue, and forced Floridians to live in fear.

Additionally, it provided \$12 million taxpayer dollars for Governor DeSantis to deceive and traffic migrants across state lines to Martha’s Vineyard just to make a political statement.

EXTRA CREDIT

SB 1174 (2024) banned the recognition of community IDs, further entrenching Florida's hostility toward immigrant communities. Community IDs are essential for marginalized groups, not just immigrants without a regulated immigration status, but also the elderly, people experiencing homelessness, domestic violence survivors, the formerly incarcerated, and others, as they provide access to basic services like healthcare, education, and disaster relief. By invalidating these IDs, in an attempt to further drive away our friends and neighbors who are immigrants, SB 1174 stripped away a crucial lifeline, leaving vulnerable individuals without the means to participate fully in society.

DO SOMETHING

DEI

HB 7 - INDIVIDUAL FREEDOM (2022)

This Florida law, the so-called Stop WOKE Act, would more accurately be named the Stop Free Speech Act. It followed a nationwide trend of censoring protected speech in schools and workplaces. The law bans teaching inclusive concepts or DEI (diversity equity and inclusion) trainings that include primarily race and gender discrimination topics. Employees are also allowed to file discrimination claims against an employer engaging in such training or discussions if it makes any person feel “discomfort.”

Why it's important

HB 7 was one of the biggest in a multi-prong effort to limit efforts to raise awareness of and combat systemic racism and sexism. It punished workplaces that want to

create a diverse, welcoming, and well-informed group of employees, and censored teachers who wanted to provide instruction about America's real history. It forces a view of American history that denies historical realities of slavery, racism, and pervasive discrimination against women and LGBTQ+ people. Rather than teaching students nuance and the nature of structural inequality, it denies that such realities exist.

Extra Credit

SB 266 (2023) took the Stop WOKE Act's assault on diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) even further by targeting Florida's higher education system. This bill prohibits the teaching of DEI, systemic racism, sexism, or LGBTQ+ identity in college teacher preparation programs. By doing so, it undermines academic freedom and the ability of educators to prepare future teachers to engage with the diverse realities of their classrooms.

CLIMATE AND ENVIRONMENT

HB 1645 - ENERGY RESOURCES (2024)

This Florida law quite literally erased the term “climate change” from most places in state statute. It also wiped out programs meant to encourage adoption of green energy sources. It further props up the fossil fuel industry, by making it much easier for companies to build facilities such as pipelines and tank farms.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

Rather than addressing the climate crisis that is obvious and urgent, this Project 2025 brain child doubled down on the use of fossil fuels and funneled more money into dirty and dying industries. It engages in complete denialism and even puts highly flammable liquid natural gas facilities above ground – which makes them susceptible to explosion. This has already happened in other parts of the country and led most states to restrict these types of facilities to below ground. HB 1645 is a regressive law that moves Florida

backwards by decades in the fight for our freedom to clean energy, clean air, clean water, and fewer natural disasters.

EXTRA CREDIT

HB 275 (2024) imposed harsh felony penalties for protesting near "critical infrastructure" like pipelines and directly targeted climate activists. It's based on a model law from ALEC, which followed protests like those against the Dakota Access Pipeline. SB 380 (2022), though it didn't pass, aimed to strip local governments of their ability to set greenhouse gas emission standards, leaving corporate polluters unchecked.

THE INSTRUMENTS

In the past 4 years, Floridians have experienced the impact of state policies that drove up the cost of housing and groceries, exacerbated the impact of climate change, diminished the quality of employment opportunities, decreased diversity and inclusion initiatives, and ultimately attacked the freedoms of all Floridians working to provide a good life for our families while concentrating the wealth we create into the hands of a few corporate elites. Voters are intimidated by new state laws, and accessing the ballot has become more complicated. Judges and other appointed positions are in the pocket of Governor DeSantis, appointed only to do his bidding.

We have seen historically marginalized populations targeted, and a white-washed American history dominating Florida lesson plans while books are banned from school libraries. Increased bullying, decreased healthcare, and an attempt to erase Black, Latino, and LGBTQ+ identity mean many people live in fear and struggle to make ends meet. 16% of LGBTQ+ families fled the state between 2022 and 2023. Immigrant families are afraid to seek healthcare and have far worse

recovery outcomes after natural disasters.

The climate, housing, and labor crisis in Florida did not occur randomly. It was the result of a carefully crafted strategy by the same people who created Project 2025. Many people may assume that their quality of life in Florida has worsened due to Federal policies and blame Congress and the Presidential administration. However, from our struggles with affordability and cost of living to the attack on our safety and our freedoms, what we are experiencing is a state level implementation of Project 2025's priorities.

But the Heritage Foundation and other authors of Project 2025 could not do this alone. They needed compliant state elected officials willing to do their bidding. Rather than serve the interests of their constituents, Governor DeSantis and these state legislators are beholden to national billionaire interest, not the welfare of the voter. **The policies they put into effect have made Florida the staging ground for what will become Project 2025's National strategy- unless we stop it.**

STATE LEGISLATORS
